Columbia Population in 2012: 804,7311

Between 2000 and 2013, South Carolina had largest percent growth of the immigrant population (99%)³

EDUCATION

Among foreign-born population 25 years and older:4

- 30% earned less than a high school diploma
- 19.9% earned a high school diploma
- 20% attended some college or earned an associate's degree
- 14% earned a bachelor's degree
- 16.1% earned a graduate or professional degree

Foreign-born from Asia: 30% have graduate or professional degree, 21.8% have bachelor's, and 19.6% have some college or associate's⁵

Foreign-born from Latin America: 5% have graduate or professional degree, 6.8% have bachelor's, 15.3% have some college or associate's, and 23.6% graduated high school⁶

LABOR & BUSINESS

• 71% of the foreign-born population is working age (native born 66.3%)
