# SALT LAKE CITY: AN IMMIGRATION SNAPSHOT

### POPULATION

Immigrants make up 11.6% of the total population (128,715 of 1,107,434 people) as of 2013<sup>1</sup>

• Naturalized: 34.9% (44,910); Not U.S. Citizen: 65.1% (83,805)

Historical immigrant share of total population:

- 2008: 12%<sup>2</sup>
- 2000: 10%<sup>3</sup>
- 1990: 3.9%4



#### LANGUAGE<sup>6</sup>

86.4% of the foreign-born population speak a language other than English at home

• 49% are limited-English-proficient (LEP)

Common languages spoken by LEP individuals:

- Spanish 68.8%,
- Chinese 4.4%,
- Vietnamese 3.2%<sup>7</sup>



## **EDUCATION**

Educational attainment of foreign-born population 25 years and older<sup>.5</sup>

- Less than high school graduate: 34%
- High school graduate: 23.9%
- Some college: 20%
- Bachelor's degree: 13.6%
- Graduate or professional degree: 8.6%

Region of Origin:

- Latin America, 56.6%
- Asia, 21.7%
- Oceania, 4%
- Africa, 3.8%
