Personal Care Aide Job Description:

- <u>Provide</u> assistance to individuals with disability or illness in completing daily tasks Entry Level Requirements:
 - Certification is not required and there are no statutory training requirements in Idaho
 - Employers may prefer some experience in home care as a minimum qualification

Certified Nursing Assistant Job Description:

- <u>Assist</u> with basic care including the monitoring of health status & medication administration
 Career Advancement Requirements:
 - Graduate from a <u>certified nursing assistant program</u> in Idaho
 - After education program complete, must pass a <u>series of exams</u> (manual skills & written/oral)

Bookkeeping, Accounting & Audit Clerk Job Description:

 <u>Compute, classify and record</u> numerical data to keep financial records accurate and complete

Entry Level Requirements:

- Certification is <u>not</u> required by Idaho law, but an Associate's degree is generally preferred
- Accounting training programs in Idaho are listed here

Accountant & Auditor Job Description:

• Analyze financial information and prepare financial reports on activities in an organization

Career Advancement Requirements:

- A Bachelor's degree with Accounting concentration
- At least 1 year of accounting experience
- Pass the <u>CPA</u> exam
- Pass the <u>AICPA Ethics exam</u> with minimum score of 90
- State residency and social security number are <u>required</u>, but there is no citizenship requirement

Registered Nurse Job Description:

• Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and administer nursing care

Entry Level Requirements:

- <u>Complete</u> a state-approved nursing program
- Pass the National Council Licensure Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN) exam (\$200)

Nurse Practitioner Job Description:

• Diagnose and treat patients independently or as part of a healthcare team

Career Advancement Requirements:

- Earn a graduate degree in a chosen nursing specialization
- Become <u>nationally certified</u> by an accredited agency & become licensed in Idaho

Immigration in Idaho

The following are facts about the immigrant community in Idaho:

- Immigrants comprise 6% of the state population and 8% of the Idaho labor force
- Top industries of immigrant employment:
 - Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing & Hunting, 13,810 workers
 - o Manufacturing, 12,713 workers
 - Health Care and Social Assistance, 9,144 workers
 - Accomodation and Food Services, 6,851 workers
 - Retail Trade, 6,264 workers
- 4,956 immigrant business owners account for 5% of all self-employed Idaho residents
- 43% of immigrants in Idaho are naturalized and another 37% are undocumented
- Top foreign-born countries of origin:

- o Mexico, 52%
- o Canada, 5%
- o Philippines, 5%
- o China, 3%
- o Germany, 2%
- 8% of native-born Idahoans are children of an immigrant
- Educational attainment of foreign-born adults in Idaho:
 - High School diploma or less 63%
 - More than HS diploma, less than Bachelor's degree 19%
 - Bachelor's degree or higher 18%
 - Share of <u>Brain Waste</u>* 24%

^{*} Share of <u>immigrant professionals</u>, who are unemployed, employed at poverty-level wages in High School diploma or less jobs, or significantly underemployed in more than HS diploma, less than Bachelor's degree jobs
