## Food Preparation Worker Job Description:

• Perform a variety of food preparation duties other than cooking

## **Entry Level Requirements:**

• Food Handler Certification – <u>not required</u> by Missouri state law, but required in Gallatin and <u>Sanders</u> county within 30 days of hire

• Obtain Food Handler Certification online <a href="here">here</a> (\$7, 2 hours); click <a href="here">here</a> to take exam in Español, 普通话, 한국어, Viêt, American Sign Language, Tagalog, Serbo-Croatian

#### Certified Food Manager Job Description:

• Responsible for food safety to protect the public from foodborne illness

#### Career Advancement Requirements:

- Pass the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) certification exam (\$55)
- Online courses are not required, but provide knowledge for the ANSI exam

#### Bookkeeping, Accounting & Audit Clerk Job Description:

 Compute, classify and record numerical data to keep financial records accurate and complete

#### Entry Level Requirements:

- Certification is <u>not</u> required by Montana law, but an Associate's degree is generally preferred
- Accounting training programs in Montana are listed <a href="here">here</a>

#### Accountant & Auditor Job Description:

• Analyze financial information and prepare financial reports on activities in an organization

#### Career Advancement Requirements:

- A Bachelor's degree with Accounting concentration
- At least 1 year of accounting experience
- Pass the <u>CPA</u> exam (Approx. \$900 with \$245 application fee)
- Pass the <u>AICPA Ethics exam</u> with minimum score of 90
- There is no citizenship, residency or social security number requirement

#### Registered Nurse Job Description:

• Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and administer nursing care

#### Entry Level <u>Requirements</u>:

- <u>Complete</u> a state-approved nursing program
- Pass the National Council Licensure Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN) exam (\$200)

#### Nurse Practitioner Job Description:

• <u>Diagnose</u> and treat patients independently or as part of a healthcare team

#### Career Advancement Requirements:

- Earn a graduate degree in a chosen nursing specialization
- Become nationally certified by an accredited agency
- Apply for license

## Immigration in Montana

The following are facts about the immigrant community in Montana:

- Immigrants comprise 2% of the state population and 2% of the Montana labor force
- Top industries of immigrant employment:
  - Health Care and Social Assistance, 3,380 workers
  - Accommodation and Food Services, 2,917 workers
  - o Educational Services, 1,900 workers
  - o Retail Trade, 1,295 workers
  - Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting, 1,172 workers
- 1,181 immigrant business owners account for 1% of all self-employed Montana residents

- 58% of immigrants in Montana are naturalized and another 12% are undocumented
- Top foreign-born countries of origin:
  - o Canada, 15%
  - o Mexico, 15%
  - o Germany, 7%
  - o China, 5%
  - Vietnam, 5%
- 4% of native-born Montanans are children of an immigrant
- Educational attainment of foreign born adults in Montana:
  - High School diploma or less 38%
  - o More than HS diploma, less than Bachelor's degree 29%
  - Bachelor's degree or higher 33%
    - Share of <u>Brain Waste</u>\* 21%

<sup>\*</sup> Share of <u>immigrant professionals</u>, who are unemployed, employed at poverty-level wages in High School diploma or less jobs, or significantly underemployed in more than HS diploma, less than Bachelor's degree jobs
