Food Preparation Worker Job Description:

• <u>Perform</u> a variety of food preparation duties other than cooking

Entry Level Requirements:

- Food Handler Certification <u>not required</u> by Nebraska state law, but it is required in Lincoln and Lancaster counties within 30 days of hire
- Food Handler Certification <u>courses are offered online</u> (\$20) by Lincoln-Lancaster counties; study guides available in <u>Spanish</u>, <u>Arabic</u>, <u>Chinese</u> & <u>Vietnamese</u>

• Other counties may obtain Food Handler Certification online <u>here</u> (\$7, 2 hours); click <u>here</u> to take exam in Español, 普通话, 한국어, Việt, American Sign Language, Tagalog, Serbo-Croatian

Certified Food Manager Job Description:

• Responsible for food safety to protect the public from foodborne illness

Career Advancement Requirements:

- <u>Pass</u> the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) certification exam (\$55)
- Online courses are not required, but provide knowledge for the ANSI exam

Bookkeeping, Accounting & Audit Clerk Job Description:

• <u>Compute, classify and record</u> numerical data to keep financial records accurate and complete

Entry Level Requirements:

- Certification is **not** required by Nebraska law, but an Associate's degree is generally preferred
- Accounting training programs in Nebraska are listed here

Accountant & Auditor Job Description:

• <u>Analyze</u> financial information and prepare financial reports on activities in an organization

Career Advancement Requirements:

- A Bachelor's degree with Accounting concentration
- At least 2 years of accounting experience
- Pass the <u>CPA</u> exam (Approx. \$900 with \$185 application fee)

- Pass the AICPA Ethics exam with minimum score of 90
- Residency and social security number are <u>required</u>, but there is no citizenship requirement

Registered Nurse Job Description:

• Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and administer nursing care

Entry Level Requirements:

- <u>Complete</u> a state-approved nursing program
- Pass the National Council Licensure Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN) exam (\$200)

Nurse Practitioner Job Description:

• <u>Diagnose</u> and treat patients independently or as part of a healthcare team

Career Advancement Requirements:

- Earn a graduate degree in a chosen nursing specialization
- Become <u>nationally certified</u> by an accredited agency &
- Apply for license

Immigration in Nebraska

The following are facts about the immigrant community in Nebraska:

- Immigrants comprise 7% of the state population and 9% of the Nebraska labor force
- Top industries of immigrant employment:
 - Manufacturing, 21,236 workers
 - Health Care and Social Assistance, 15,806 workers
 - \circ Construction, 10,708 workers
 - Retail Trade, 9,039 workers
 - Educational Services, 8,356 workers

- 7,748 immigrant business owners account for 7% of all self-employed Nebraska residents
- 40% of immigrants in Nebraska are naturalized and another 41% are undocumented
- Top foreign-born countries of origin:
 - Mexico, 34%
 - Guatemala, 7%
 - India, 5%
 - Myanmar, 4%
 - Vietnam, 4%
- 7% of native-born Nebraskans are children of an immigrant
- Educational attainment of foreign born adults in Nebraska:
 - \circ High School diploma or less 58%
 - \circ More than HS diploma, less than Bachelor's degree 18%
 - Bachelor's degree or higher 24%
 - Share of <u>Brain Waste</u>* 28%

* Share of <u>immigrant professionals</u>, who are unemployed, employed at poverty-level wages in High School diploma or less jobs, or significantly underemployed in more than HS diploma, less than Bachelor's degree jobs
