Immigration in New York

- Immigrants comprise roughly <u>22.9% of the state population and 27.8% of the New York labor</u> <u>force</u>
- Top industries of immigrant employment:
 - Health Care and Social Assistance, 590,921 workers
 - Accommodation and Food Services, 320,089 workers
 - Retail Trade, 297,246 workers
 - Construction, 231,459 workers
 - Other Services (excl. Public Administration), 221,118 workers
- Nearly 347,573 immigrant business owners accounted for 33.8% of all self-employed New York resident
- 55.2% of immigrants in New York are naturalized and another 17% are undocumented
- Top foreign-born countries of origin:
 - o Dominican Republic, 11.2%
 - o China, 8.7%
 - o Jamaica, 5.2%
 - o Mexico, 5.2%
 - o Ecuador, 4.2%
- About 17.2% of native-born New Yorkers are children of an immigrant

Promotion Opportunities with License or Certification

Personal Care Aide (PCA)

Job Description

- <u>Assist</u> the elderly, convalescents, or persons with disabilities with daily living activities at the person's home or in a care facility
- Duties performed at a place of residence may include keeping house (making beds, doing laundry, washing dishes) and preparing meals
- May provide assistance at non-residential care facilities. May advise families, the elderly, convalescents, and persons with disabilities regarding such things as nutrition, cleanliness, and household activities

Licensing/Certification Requirements

- Certification is not required unless employed in federally funded Medicaid programs. However, many employers take part in federally funded Medicaid and require PCA certification.
 - To obtain PCA certification, the State of New York <u>requires</u>:
 - 40 hours of training from an approved training program
 - A state competency evaluation with written and/or oral examinations, observation and demonstration, performing the required skills in the laboratory or patient care setting
 - Many employers and training programs offer free PCA training

For Immigrants

- Requirements for immigrants are the same as native-born residents
- Some programs offer training and evaluation in a foreign language

Promotion Opportunities:

Home Health Aide (HHA)

Job Description

• <u>Provide</u> routine individualized healthcare such as changing bandages and dressing wounds, and applying topical medications to the elderly, convalescents, or persons with disabilities at the patient's home or in a care facility

BACK TO TOP

 Monitor or report changes in health status. May also provide personal care such as bathing, dressing, and grooming of patient.

Licensing/Certification Requirements

- The state of New York <u>requires</u>
 - 75 hours of training from a state approved training program (certified PCAs require only 35 additional training hours)
 - A state competency evaluation with written and/or oral examinations, observation and demonstration, performing the required skills in the laboratory or patient care setting
 - Many employers and training programs offer free training for the promotion's requirements

For Immigrants

- Requirements for immigrants are the same as native-born residents
- Some programs offer training and evaluation in a foreign language

Certified Nursing Aide (CNA)

Job Description

- <u>Provide</u> basic patient care under direction of nursing staff. Perform duties such as feed, bathe, dress, groom, or move patients, or change linens
- May transfer or transport patients. Includes nursing care attendants, nursing aides, and nursing attendants

Licensing/Certification Requirements

- CNA certification is valid for 2 years and requires:
 - Completion of a state-approved training program for a minimum 100 hours of training
 - Passing a New York State Nursing Home Nurse Aide Competency Examination through Prometric

For Immigrants

- Exams are only given in English
 - If English is your second language, you may be granted a possible <u>time extension</u> when taking the CNA test
