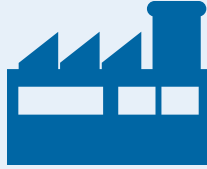


Refugees Make America Stronger

Refugees Work Hard

On average, refugees have a **higher employment rate** than the native-born population.

Refugees contributed **\$20.9 billion in taxes** in 2015.

Refugees held **\$56.3 billion in spending power** in 2015.

Many large states rely on refugee spending power, including **California and Texas**.

Refugees Create Jobs



Refugees have **higher entrepreneurship rates** than both the U.S.-born population and the foreign-born population.

In 2015, over 181,000 refugee entrepreneurs generated **\$4.6 billion in business income**.

Major companies including **Google, Whatsapp, and Paypal** owe their starts to refugee entrepreneurship.
